District Catalog of Open Public Records: A Contribution for Open Government and Direct Democracy in Bogota City, Colombia

At the end of this year, the Archive of Bogotá, Colombia participated in the Rome2022 Annual Conference organized by the ICA (International Council of Archives) whose theme was focused on closing the gaps between Archives and Democracy in the world.

In this context, the Bogotá Archive presented the progress of a project related to this approach called the Catalog of Open Public Archives. In the first instance, this was an excellent space to show the archival world what the Bogotá Archive is doing in terms of document management in our country and, on the other hand, to learn that the archives of other cities and countries in the world also have similar needs - those of Bogotá on issues related to document management and archive administration.

It was observed that many archives in the world have a very important role in democratization processes with the purpose of bringing archives closer to citizens. In this act it was also observed that the public archives are proposing different types of projects, services and solutions that bring the archives closer to the citizens. Therefore, it was possible to learn about the different types of projects and initiatives that exist in various countries to give greater access and visibility to public and heritage archives so that citizens can use them in the exercise of their rights. In this sense, the advances that the Archive of Bogotá has to date in the District Catalog of Open Public Archives, promoted by the General Secretariat of the Mayor's Office of the City of Bogotá, the capital of Colombia in South America, were presented. The objective of this new service is to make visible and facilitate the search for and access to the files that are produced in the 60 public institutions of the district during the first phase of the document management life cycle. Through this catalog it is intended to guarantee citizens the exercise of the right of access to public information produced by the District Administration of Bogotá and therefore, it becomes an excellent example of open government, public transparency and direct democracy.

The different phases, advances and first achievements of the implementation process were presented, as well as the results and products that are already available to date. Finally, we will close this presentation by indicating the associated benefits for citizens and institutions, as well as the lessons learned.

Document Management Seen from Digital Transformation

From the Bogotá Archive this year we managed to advance in the digital transformation agenda whose main objective is to achieve organizational improvement, be more competitive and improve services to the citizens of Bogotá in order to contribute to the efficiency of public management as well as facilitate access to public information for citizens.

In this sense, the digital transformation focused on four dimensions: the strategic dimension, the process dimension, the human talent dimension and the technological dimension.

Through the strategic dimension, it is sought that the document management process is positioned at the senior management level as part of the intellectual capital of an institution, giving it the value that corresponds to it as an input for decision-making and as an asset of information and knowledge in the context of business knowledge management. From the dimension of processes, document management is projected as a strategic process because it is a transversal process to all business processes of the institution or company. From the dimension of human talent, it is considered necessary to adapt, update and rethink the role played by human talent specialized in document management within the organization. Finally, from the technological dimension, it must be said that it is not the most important thing in a digital transformation process, but rather it is the means through which innovation processes can be stimulated, from the most basic to the most complex so that they can be achieved. Modernization results real and appropriate to the needs and conditions of the institution or company in terms of document management.

In conclusion, the digital transformation applied to document management is a strategic decision that is not only limited to the use of technology, but must also consider other much more important factors such as optimized document processes and of course human talent, since without their assistance and their intervention this would not be possible.
